2009 Continuum of Care Priorities

1. Priority will be given to permanent supportive housing project applications for the chronic homeless. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) defines a chronically homeless person as an unaccompanied disabled individual who has been continuously homeless for over one year.
2. The Norfolk Homeless Consortium will not accept project applications that serve chronic homeless individuals that have identified HIV as their only disability.

2009 Continuum of Care Project Guidelines

1. New projects must meet an eight unit minimum threshold. However, additional consideration will be given to projects that are larger than the minimum eight units. Projects can meet this threshold using one of two methods:
 - i. add units to an existing Continuum of Care funded program or
 - ii. a new project may apply for funding over two years to reach the required minimum units.
2. New projects may use up to 20% of its funding request for support services.
3. New projects must support the goals of the Norfolk Blueprint of the Plan to End Homelessness.

PLEASE NOTE: All Continuum of Care applicants (new and renewal projects) are required to attend 80% of Continuum of Care Committee meetings. Continuum of Care applicants should also attend Norfolk Homeless Consortium membership meetings and pay membership dues.
